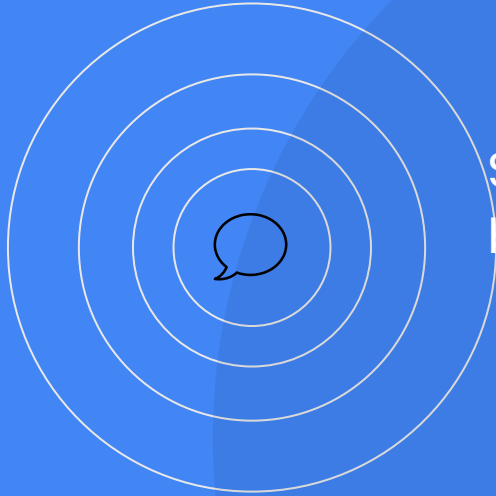

What is the DELF?

The DELF exams are six separate diplomas issued by the French Ministry for National Education to certify the French language skills. These diplomas are valid for life. DELF certificates are developed by the Centre International d'Etudes Pédagogiques (CIEP) and reflect the six levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL).

- In 2017, the DELF examinations were available in 173 countries.

DELFI in CESD



Since 2014, students in grades 8, 10 and 12 have written DELFI exams in April each year. The school division targets the following years and levels:

DELFD and DALFD evaluate language skills in four areas:

- oral comprehension,
- oral expression,
- written comprehension,
- written expression.

Results



- Since 2014, more than 150 students have written their DELF exam with 100% success at levels A2, B1 and B2
- Several teachers in our school division have been trained as DELF examiners.
- Levels of achievement in the four language skills continue to improve.

Why take the DELF exam?



In Canada, **more than 35,000 Canadians** have taken DELF exams over the past few years. As a result, the DELF examinations are becoming more well-known and receiving greater recognition from administrative organizations, employers, and educational institutions.

Obtaining the DELF B2 provides entrance language tests and credits at several Canadian universities

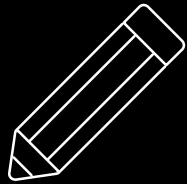

 - Spoken reception / Listening
 - Overall reading comprehension
 - Overall spoken production
 - Overall spoken interaction Writing.

DELF (diplôme d'études en langue française) Level B2



- Diploma awarded by the French Ministry of Education
- This exam takes into account all language skills (reading, writing, speaking and listening)
- Recognized globally as a language standard.
- Recognized as fulfilling French language entrance requirements by French Universities.



French Immersion Certificate

- Students will attain a CESD French Immersion Certificate upon completion of the French Immersion program.
- French Immersion Certification requires the completion of the following courses:
 - French Language Arts 9, 10-2, 20-2, 30-2
 - Études Sociales (Social Studies) 9
 - French Vernacular 15, 25



Our Program's Evolution

- More class time spent using French.
- Greater opportunity to use their French, particularly in an oral capacity.
- French classes that continued to the end of grade twelve.
- Maintain their level of fluency in order to access French courses in post secondary institutions.
- Time for specific DELF preparation.
